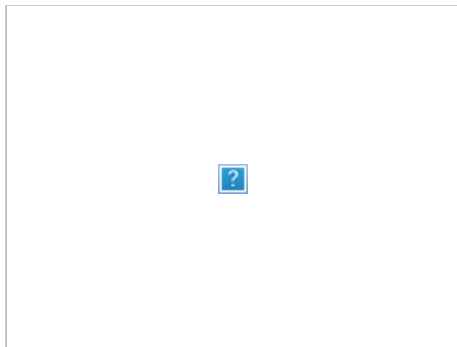
We received the sad news that Bruce Clark (who was Amanda Dunn's cousin) passed away in January 2003.

I completed a Business Studies degree, with an accounting major and



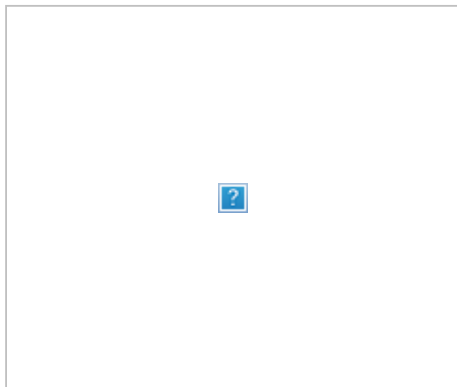

The sugar cane farm? We didn't get to make the move to Queensland permanently, but ran the farm for five years with a manager, before deciding to sell and purchase 5 acres in Kenthurst, where we are still enjoying life today.
